


Welcome to Troop 750!

Where do I start?

In order to best connect with you, Troop 750 has multiple forms of communication.

Our Schedule

Our year-round program enables Scouts to enjoy both Scouting and plenty of other activities and hobbies. We recognize the issues and scheduling conflicts, so we meet every other Monday to allow parents to schedule other events. Boy Led

Troop 750 founds itself on the idea of being boy led. As Scouts grow in the Troop, their leadership skills are used and applied in various positions. The elected Scouts are expected to run meetings, plan outings, coordinate activities, and lead campouts. The Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters facilitate the program and ensure safety.

If your Scout has any issues or questions within the Troop, he should first contact his Patrol Leader and then his Senior Patrol Leader. If there is a problem that you would like to remain private, you can email the Scoutmaster.

Meetings

Troop 750 has meetings every other Monday at 6:00pm to 7:45pm at the [REDACTED]. Meeting agendas are decided upon by the Senior Patrol Leader.

Parents are able to attend. Due to high noise levels, however, we respectfully request that discussion among adults during meetings be taken outside.

Parent Involvement

Troop 750 wants the parents to watch their child grow up in their Scouting environment. We encourage participation in the Troop. We are a volunteer organization, and cannot function without the parents being involved.

We are always in need of parents to drive, participate in planning, join the committee, become a merit badge counselor, and plenty of other things. Feel free to contact our Scoutmaster if you are interested.

Paying for Camp

Troop 750 allows parents to pay online through troop750.com/q-store. You can also pay at meetings. We offer fundraisers throughout the year for Scouts to raise money for camp. We also offer an annual campership (*scholarship*) for summer camp each year.

Uniform

Troop 750 requires field uniform during meetings. We define the field uniform as tan Class A shirt, green pants/shorts, and shoes. During a Court of Honor or ceremony, Troop 750 requires a complete Class A uniform. We define this as the tan Class A shirt, green pants, neckerchief and slide, belt, and shoes.

During campouts, you may wear Class B uniform (*Troop 750 apparel*) and other clothes. You can purchase Troop 750 apparel during a meeting or online at troop750.com/q-store. Note that if you choose to purchase Troop 750 apparel online, you will need to pick up the product at a meeting.

Code of Conduct

Troop 750 will always put safety first when it comes to Boy Scouts. Whether it is the influence of other Scouts or issues with bullying, Troop 750 will continue to ensure parents that their Scout will be safe and well taken care of. That being said, in order to ensure the safety of Scouts, Troop 750 must have a code of conduct for those that threaten the safety of other Scouts.

Code of Conduct

1. Boy Scouts are to follow the Scout Oath and Law to the best of their ability.
2. Boy Scouts will not be allowed to downgrade others. Speech should be used to edify and uplift.
3. Boy Scouts should abstain from the use of alcohol, tobacco products, and other substances.
4. Swearing, inappropriate language, and innuendos are regarded as unfit language.
5. Fires and open flames are limited to campfire/light use only.
6. Scouts must earn the *Firem'n Chit* before handling open flames.
7. Knives, axes, and saws are to be used strictly for the benefit of the Troop.
8. Scouts must earn the *Totin' Chip* before handling sharp tools.
9. Scouts may carry no knife with a blade exceeding 4 inches.
10. Vandalism, defacing property, and stealing are prohibited in the Troop.
11. Scouts are to respect others and their property.
12. Firearms, fireworks, etc. are prohibited on any activity unless approved otherwise.
13. Fighting, punching, kicking, physical roughness, etc. is considered unacceptable.
14. Lying and cheating are considered wrong by the Scout Oath and Law.
15. Inappropriate contact with the opposite gender is prohibited by Troop 750.
16. Both the Scout Oath and Law will be the guide to the preservation of morals and values.
17. Any unlisted action may be considered unruly by the Scout Oath and Law.

If any Scout breaks the **Code of Conduct**, Troop 750 reserves the right to take action to ensure the safety and wellbeing of other Scouts.

Disciplinary Policies

1. Probation

Scouts may face probation if the **Code of Conduct** has been broken. Scouts may face a denial to the Order of the Arrow, and other suspension due to the Scout's behavior. Probation may also include not allowing the Scout to attend a certain activity. Usually lying, stealing, and other issues will face the punishment of probation.

2. Suspension

Scouts will face suspension if the **Code of Conduct** has been broken enough times. Scouts that choose to ignore the rules set in place may expect Troop 750 to solve the issue through suspension. Suspension can involve the denial of access to meetings, events, activities, campouts, etc. for a period of time. Scouts may also face suspension if they have used unacceptable substances, acted inappropriately with the opposite gender, used physical force against other Scouts, and other more dangerous actions.

3. Expulsion

Scouts will face expulsion if the **Code of Conduct** has been broken and the PLC and Scoutmaster believe the Scout is a danger to others. Expulsion is defined as the permanent exclusion of a Scout from any and all activities, meetings, campouts, etc. Scouts that have been expelled may not join with the Troop unless otherwise decided upon by the Scoutmaster and PLC. Expulsion is reserved for Scouts that pose a threat to other Scouts, continually ignore the **Code of Conduct**, or have influenced a younger generation of Scouts incorrectly.

Policies may be used, but must be agreed upon by the PLC, Scoutmaster, and Committee.

Conduct Contract

Troop 750 is dedicated to the safety and wellbeing of each and every Scout. In order to ensure complete safety, Troop 750 must have a certain code of morals and values put in to effect. This contract, that must be signed by every Scout and parent, ensures parents that Troop 750 will take care of all problems. Not only does this contract assist parents, it also allows Troop 750 to build a better environment of learning and productivity in the Troop.
